The London Abused Women's Centre (LAWC) provides many important, confidential, non-residential services to girls and women over the age of 12 who are or have been abused by their intimate partner, john, pimp, or trafficker. We offer safety planning, advocacy, woman-centred, feminist counselling, transitional support, and information about legal, housing and other community resources.

To be able to provide these services to women in the London community at no-cost and in a timely manner, we need to do fundraising.

That is where our Special Events Volunteers come in. During the year, LAWC holds various fundraisers of different sizes. The following are our 4 major fundraisers:

- Annual International Women's Day Breakfast & Auction on or before March 8th
- Annual Downtown 5K Run with Runners Choice on Good Friday
- Purple in the Park with the London Majors Baseball Club in the Summer
- Shine the Light on Woman Abuse Campaign:
 - Each year during the month of November, several fundraising and awareness-raising events take place including a Basketball Game with the London Lightning, Wear Purple Day, and a Cocktail Appreciation Party for our Campaign Sponsors

- Informing businesses and the public about campaigns
- Preparing for events and setting up event spaces
